SHIPPING AND HANDLING

Shipping: Allow 2-3 days from shipping date for arrival of plant materials.

Other products may travel more slowly. Our staff can estimate the cost of shipping and handling for you. **All products are FOB Tualatin, Oregon.**

Carrier Providers: UPS, FEDEX, 2 or 3 Day - Common carrier

Customer pick-up: Orders may be picked up at the nursery. At the time you place your order, please specify a pick-up date. Please order **one week** prior to a pick-up date.

Canadian shipments: An additional fee of \$35.00 is required to process all certificates and paperwork for export,

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Prices effective September 1, 2007. Subject to change without notice.

Wholesale prices are intended for wholesale nurseries, retail garden centers, landscape contractors, architects and designers, government agencies and non-profit groups for landscaping purposes. Business license and/or tax identification are required for verification and accounting purposes.

Substitutions and cancellations: Changes or cancellations must be made at least one week in advance of shipping/pick-up date to avoid a 20% restocking charge. Shortages of plants may occur throughout the season. If plant substitutions of equal or better value are acceptable, please indicate in the appropriate space on the order form.

Payment terms: Unless credit has been established, orders must be prepaid with check, money order or Visa/Mastercard. Please make checks payable to *Hughes Water Gardens*. **Sorry, no CODs.**

Credit Account: Credit terms are Net 30 Days. A 1.5 % per month (18% per annum) finance charge will be added to all past due accounts. Request a credit application by calling (503) 638-1004.

Returns: Make note of damaged packages on shipping document and immediately notify the carrier. Damage claims must be submitted directly to the carrier. All plants leave our premises in top condition. Should you have any problems with plant materials, we require notification within 7 days of delivery. Please do not return plants without authorization.

Water Lily Tuber Collections

Water Lily Collection #1 - Five (5) waterlilies of mixed sizes and colors. Maximum variety.

Water Lily Collection #2 - Five (5) small waterlilies and mixed colors. Excellent for small ponds and tub gardens.

Water Lily Collection #3 - Five (5) medium waterlilies of mixed colors. Nice selection for moderate sized ponds.

Water Lily Collection #4 - Five (5) large waterlilies of mixed colors. Great for large ponds and deep water situations.

To pot water lilies: *Trim away spent blossoms and old leaves at the base of their stems, close to the tuber. This is done to reduce buoyancy. Young unfurled leaves remain attached. Cut back excessively long white anchoring roots to within 2" of the tuber. Leave black feeding roots undisturbed. Fill a pot three-quarters full with dampened garden soil - heavy loam or clay soils are best. Position the tuber horizontally, 1" from the pot rim. Point the crown towards the center of the pot. Plant at a slight angle so that only the crown is exposed. Bury 2 aquatic fertilizer tablets near the tuber. Top with pea gravel to anchor the tuber (do not bury the crown). This will also prevent soil from fouling the pond. Gently tilt the pot, approximating the angle of the tuber. Slowly lower it into the pond, allowing air bubbles to escape.*
